firing my own *pistol about*
4 p.m., and had reloaded the magazine
to put the first cartridge into the

Squeezed the pistol between my knees to
pull back the spring, because it was stiff,
the safety catch was up at the time, and
with the sudden jerk of releasing the spring
somewhat unconsciously has placed my
finger on the trigger and fired the
pistol - the bullet went through the calf
of my left leg. I walked to Ashbourne Rd.
Main Car Terminus, to get a car to Midland
Stn. from whence I took a taxi to the Military
Station Hospital, Normanton Barracks.

Lieut Thomas Stokes Elliot R.A.M.E.
having been duly sworn states. On 27th Dec^r 1915
I saw Private B. Denlop N. Humeau in
the Military Hospital, ^{Normanton Barracks, Derby} about 10 am
and found him to be suffering from
a bullet wound in the upper part of
calf of left leg. it is simply a flesh
wound, and uncomplicated by either
fracture or haemorrhage, the bullet
entered on inner side of left leg, and
passed out on outer side at about
level.
